What is the Warm Hand-Off Project?

The project was developed in response to the growing opioid abuse epidemic. When a person with substance use disorder presents with a need for treatment, call us. We provide a warm hand-off to the appropriate provider after meeting with the patient.

A team of licensed, certified and experienced professionals works together to help provide access to the services needed to support recovery for those suffering from opioid use disorders. Mobile Crisis can also assist with a mental health crisis, suicide attempt or if you are unsure.

How Do I Refer?

A dedicated rapid access line will triage the call to a mobile engagement specialist who will come to the patient's location.

Office hours: Monday to Friday, 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. If someone presents after hours, staff will take information for triage at 8 a.m. the next business day.

Who Does the Warm Hand-Off Program Serve?

- Men or women over age 18, with an opioid use disorder who live in Montgomery County
- Anyone needing information about and help accessing Medication-Assisted Treatment (MAT) such as Buprenorphine or Vivitrol to prevent symptoms of detox
- Anyone needing recovery support and guidance
