Sinai Medical Center, Los Angeles, in 2003. In 1995, he became a Medical Officer for the Emergency Department of the Italian Air Force. Most recently, he held several positions with Jefferson Health - Northeast including, but not limited to Director of Bariatric Surgery Program and Services, and Director of Minimally Invasive Surgery and Robotic Surgery.

Dr. Giordano is board certified in general surgery by the American Boards of Surgeons.

He has authored and co-authored numerous publications on minimally invasive surgery, robotic surgery and laparoscopic surgery.

Dr. Giordano has been recognized as a principal investigator grant recipient for his publications on Intracorporeal versus Extracorporeal Anastomosis in 2018 for Minimally Invasive Right Colectomy and Robotic versus Laparoscopic Sigmoid in 2020.

He has co-authored several book chapters on Laparoscopic foregut surgery, Laparoscopic approaches to gallbladder disease and Hernia repairs.

Dr. Giordano has presented at numerous scientific meetings, most recently at Minimally Invasive Surgery Week 2018 in New York, NY, where he was invited to speak on Robotic Surgery Applications to General Surgery.

He was awarded the "Mohan B. Sad Award" for best chief resident in 2002. In 2003, he was specially recognized with an ETHICON honor for his contribution in the development and evolution of Bariatric Surgery. Dr. Giordano has been a Philadelphia Magazine Top Doctors award recipient in 2018, 2019 and 2020.
