He has also contributed to the following textbooks: *Surgical Laparoscopy*, *Operative Laparoscopy and Thoracoscopy*, and *Minimally Invasive Surgery: Principles and Outcomes*. He has been the author/co-author of numerous regional presentations, including meetings of the Southeastern Surgical Congress, the Frederick A. Collier Surgical Society, and the 12th World Congress of Laparoscopic Surgery of the Society of American Gastrointestinal Endoscopic Surgeons, and "Hernia Repair 2010" of the American Hernia Society. He is a Fellow of the American College of Surgeons and the Philadelphia Academy of Surgery, and a Member of the Society of American Gastrointestinal Endoscopic Surgeons, and the Montgomery County Medical Society.
