The Asplundh Cancer Pavilion has been evaluated and honored with accreditation by the Commission on Cancer of the American College of Surgeons. Such official recognition assures patients that our center meets the highest national standards for prevention, early detection, diagnosis and treatment. What's more, our center was selected as a Blue Distinction Center for Complex and Rare Cancers. This designation was given for our demonstrated depth of multidisciplinary expertise and experience treating 14 rare cancers, such as thyroid, liver and bladder cancer.
